Safe Boating Week

Safe Boating Week is May 22-28. Thanks to Anne Taylor, Public Relations Officer, the week has been covered in the media with one article in Baytoday and two Cogeco TV interviews. This year theses are the messages:

- 1. **Wear a life jacket.** They don't work if you don't wear them. Over 80% of people who drown from boats were not wearing their lifejacket.
- 2. **Boat sober.** Impaired boating is impaired driving.
- 3. **Be Prepared.** Both you and your boat. Check that you have all required safety equipment, the weather is suitable, you have enough fuel and you have files a trip plan with someone on land.
- 4. **Take a Boat Safety Course**. PCOC will get you out on the water, a CPS Boating Course will get you back safely.
- 5. **Be Aware of Cold Water Risks.** Cold water severely impacts your ability to swim and float in the water. Wearing a lifejacket is your best chance to survive.


Meet Ups
