



PFD's and colours changes:

FROM the Office of Boating Safety - Canadian Coast Guard

Although newstandards expand the range of colours for PFDs, it is imperative to check for the approval label. Old PFD's inpreviously unapproved colours, are not approved under the more flexible standards. Variations in colour dyes and material may affect the integrity of the devices and if they have not been Canadian tested and approved, the PFD does not meet Canadian safety requirements.

Remember, when choosing any approved PFD, keep in mind the need for visibility.
