

Given that the new boating regulations are in effect this summer, it was felt that we should have a high profile and offer the exam for people to challenge. The Pleasure Craft Operators Card & the Age/Horsepower Restrictions

- Firstly, the PCOC and the Agrethos epower Restrictions are two separate acts of legislation. They are not tied to each other.
- Eventually anyone operating a 'power driven vesse' will require a PCOC. This includes electric motors.

PCOC Rules:

- > As of September 15, 1999, all operators of pleasure craft fitted with a motor and used for recreational purposes, born after April 1, 1983, required a PCOC.
- As of September 15, 2002, all operators of pleasure craft under 4 m in length, including personal watercraft, fitted with a motor and used for recreational purposes will require a PCOC.
- As of September 15, 2009, all operators of pleasure craft fitted with a motor and used for recreational purposes will require a PCOC.

Age Horsepower Restrictions, as of April 1, 1999;

- Under 12 years of age, and not directly supervised, can operate a vessel with no more than 10 hp.
- > Between 12 years of age and under 16 years of age and not directly supervised, can operate a vessel with no more than 40 hp.
- > No person under 16 years of agem ay operate a Personal Water Craft.
- > There are no power restrictions for anyone 16 years of age and over

Note that directly supervised means accompanied and directly supervised by a pesion 16 years of age or older.

This means that even with a PCOC arryone under 16 cannot operate a PWC. If the son/daughter/other youngster is operating the boat and age hp. restrictions apply you better be beside the youngster.

Even with a valid PCOC the age has epower restrictions
STILL APPLY. It is essential that everyone understand that the
PCOC and Age/Horsepower Restrictions are two separate
issues and the two matters are NOT field together.
