## PCOC Card Notes Caven Ford P

Who needs proof of competency NOW?

If you are operating a motorized pleasure craft 4 metres (13.1) in length or if you were born after April 1, 1983 and operating any motorized pleasure craft, you require proof of competency now. The PCOC Card is the most common method of proving competency. On September 15, 2009, all boat operators will need a PCOC or other proof of competency to operate any motorized pleasure craft. The Competency of Operators of Pleasure Craft Regulations require operators (as described above) of pleasure craft fitted with a motor and used for recreational purposes to carry proof of competency or risk fines up to \$250. Any regulatory agency with water presence that is authorized to stop you to check for infractions or that has the authority to issue fines can ask for proof of competency. The PCOC card can be obtained from many providers in Canada of which CPS is one. In the event you lose or destroy your card, contact the agency from which you obtained the card to see if they have a mechanism in place to replace it. Most don't, however CPS will replace a card for a fee of \$20.00. Contact CPS headquarters:


